Important Dates to Remember:

Registration for camp should be done by April 1st.

Verses must be completed by June 4th.

1. You will be assigned to an adult hearer, who will listen to you quote verses and check your answers.
2. You must quote the entire lesson at one time.
The questions in each lesson must be completed prior to reciting the verses.
3. You must recite the reference and verse word-for-word.
4. You may only do one lesson per week.
5. The adult hearer must sign and date the bottom of each lesson as it is completed.
6. Turn in your completed book to the church office.
